Deacons Support COTS with School Supplies

Please consider purchasing the following school supplies for COTS (Creating Opportunities to Succeed). You can place these supplies in a bin outside the Eagle Entrance. COVID-19 Relief Fund

The Session approved the establishment of a COVID-19 relief fund for anyone who is in need of assistance with rent, utilities, groceries, medical expenses, etc., during this crisis. A total of over \$50,000 has been donated and over \$25,000 has been disbursed so far. This fund is managed by the Deacons. Forgotten Harvest Food Delivery
